



MICHAEL FRANCIS Conductor

British conductor Michael Francis is one of a young generation of conductor whose presence is being felt on both sides of the Atlantic. In Autumn 2015 Michael Francis took up his post as Music Director of the Florida Orchestra in Tampa, FL. In Summer 2016 Michael Francis presided over his second season as Music Director of the Mainly Mozart Festival, San Diego – only the second Music Director to follow in the footsteps of its' founder, David Atherton. He was Chief Conductor and Artistic Advisor of the Norrköping Symphony Orchestra 2012 - 2016.

In Europe, Francis has conducted the London Symphony Orchestra, where, as a member of the double bass section of the orchestra his conducting skills firstly came to prominence with a remarkable debut in 2007 when he replaced an indisposed Valery Gergiev at the BBC's Gubaidulina Festival in London's Barbican. 2017/18 season includes performances with London's Philharmonia, BBC Philharmonic, Bayerische Rundfunk Symphony Orchestra, Berlin Radio Symphony Orchestra and Komische Oper Berlin. He makes a welcome return to Seoul Philharmonic and in USA he will conduct the Milwaukee and Indianapolis Symphony Orchestras. Soloists Michael Francis will collaborate with next season include Ian Bostridge, Ray Chen, Maximilian Hornung, the Labéque sisters, Daniel Müller-Schott, Javier Perianes and Joyce Yang.

Michael Francis maintains an impressive schedule of guest engagements having recently guest conducted the Montreal Symphony, Toronto Symphony with Emanuel Ax as soloist, Atlanta Symphony with Benjamin Grosvenor and in New York he made his debut with the Orchestra of St Luke's. He has also conducted the San Francisco, Cincinnati, Seattle, New World Symphony orchestras, Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, English Chamber Orchestra, Orchestra of the Mariinsky Theatre, Malaysia Philharmonic, Stuttgart Radio Symphony, Helsinki Philharmonic, and Radio and Television orchestra of Madrid. Passionate about working with professional musicians of tomorrow Francis has recently undertaken two extensive projects with the Canadian Youth Orchestra of Canada and National Youth Orchestra of Scotland the latter in collaboration with Håkan Hardenberger as soloist.

Michael Francis has released a recording of the complete Rachmaninov piano concertos with Valentina Lisitsa and the London Symphony Orchestra for Decca in 2013. Francis has recorded Rihm's *Lichtes Spiel* with Anne-Sophie Mutter and the New York Philharmonic (Deutsche Grammophon 2011). Previous recordings with the London Symphony include the Rachmaninov/ Warenberg piano concerto No.5 and Shostakovich No.2 with Julius-Jeongwon Kim (Sony 2011) and the Ravel and Gershwin piano concertos with Ian Parker (Atma 2010).

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
