



ROBERT NEUMANN Piano

19-year-old Robert Neumann is the winner of numerous competitions. In 2017, he was recognized as an "exceptional talent" and "one of the most promising pianistic talents" and given the International Classical Music Discovery Award. Since autumn 2018 Robert has been chosen as "SWR2 New Talent". The Südwestrundfunk radio of culture supports him with concerts, studio productions, and a media presence in broadcasts as well as online for three years.

He grew up in a family of musicians, and since the age of four, Monika Giurgiuman taught him at the Stuttgarter Musikschule. At eleven Robert was accepted as a junior student in the class of Prof. Elza Kolodin at the Musikhochschule Freiburg; 15-year-old Robert was already working on his BA in music.

Since 2017 Robert Neumann has been supported by the Mozart Society Dortmund, the Studienstiftung des Deutschen Volkes, and scholarships from the Deutsche Stiftung Musikleben and Yamaha Music Foundation.

Robert Neumann has already worked with many orchestras, including guest appearances with the Deutsche Staatsphilharmonie Rheinland-Pfalz, Folkwang Kammerorchester Essen, the SWR Symphonie Orchester, Moscow Symphony Orchestra, the Südwestdeutsche Philharmonie Konstanz, Stuttgarter Philharmoniker, the National Philharmonie Moldau, Sinfonieorchester Liechtenstein and the Gewandhausorchester Leipzig. He has collaborated with conductors such as Francesco Angelico, Dan Ettinger, Ruben Gazarian, Kerem Hasan and Stefan Sanderling.

He starts the 2020/21 season with a chamber music tour together with Stefan Dohr, Sebastian Manz, Guilhaume Santana, Tanja Tetzlaff and Dominique Wollenweber, with concerts in Bamberg, Heilbronn and Potsdam. During the season he plays solo recitals in Schweinfurt, Böblingen, Biel/CH, Hannover, Ludwigshafen, Olpe, Edenkoben, Sinsheim, Hildesheim and Polling. He also gives his debut with the Symphonie Orchester Göttingen.

In Potsdam, Robert Neumann is presented in a new young artists programme for three years, with a recital, chamber music, education projects and in cooperation with the Kammerakademie Potsdam.
